- The 30 women micro-finance project was formed to strive for togetherness in the association and community to address problems
- It's goal is to create a welfare community that is free from poverty, and to improve the diet of the community
- By maize planting, cattle rearing and a piggery it is hoped to improve diet and health status of the community, increase economic welfare, facilitate orphans and vulnerable people with disabilities in the community by providing essential commodities, and facilitate income generating activities for child-headed families
